Dear Customer,

Apalachee Nursery has been growing since 1979. We specialize in propagating and growing plants native to the Eastern United States. We use Apalachee, the Cherokee name for the North American continent, as our name.

Since we are limited in space, we concentrate on bed growing shrub liners. This gives us an opportunity to service wholesale growers who might prefer a selection of bed grown and/or container grown native shrubs available at one nursery.

We are located in a region that has one of the greatest diversity of plant species in the world. This diversity is in large part due to our high rainfall, rich soils and the combination of warm days and cool nights during the growing season. These factors also give our crops most favorable growing conditions. Our plant material is nursery propagated from seeds, cuttings or divisions. All bareroot liners are grown on raised beds in enriched soil conditions amended with pine bark, compost and/or peat moss. Apalachee Nursery is located in Zone 6 of the Southern Appalachian mountains at an elevation of 1600'.

We try to grow the best cultivars available to each plant species. We not only have those species that are easier to grow; those plants in general that can handle the wetter, tighter soil conditions; but we also try to grow the species that are more of a challenge. These include mainly plants that are members of the ericaceous (heath) plant family, in particular, the native Azaleas, which we grow in quantities, mainly from seed. Some would say that the ericates are the aristocrats of all plant families, since there are so many truly beautiful and ornamental plants within its membership. Most of the species and/or cultivars that we produce are hardy to Zone 5, Please feel free to come by and visit with us. Thank you for your interest.

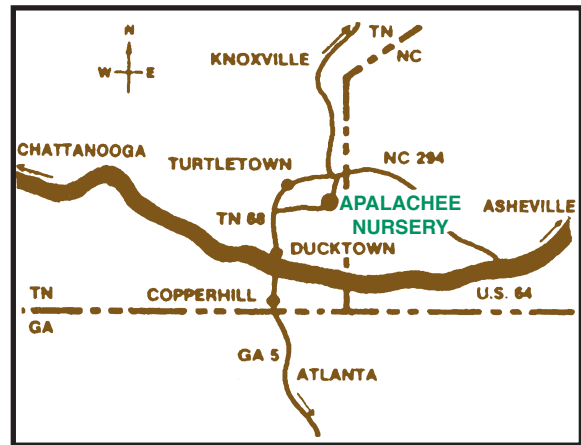

Yellowroot: Deciduous plant that can be used as a ground cover. Here in the mountains it grows mostly on creek and branch banks in shady conditions. Will also grow in full sun, especially where the soil has been amended. A 100 plus year old planting at the Arnold Arboretum in Boston is still in excellent condition.

**FOTHERGILLA MAJOR ZONE 4**

Large Fothergilla: A mountain plant that grows in the wild with members of the Heath family. Generally 10' to 12' in height. Bottlebrush-like blooms with red, orange, and yellow Fall leaf coloration. Used en masse and as an accent or foundation planting. Plants are propagated from Linville Gorge, NC seed source.

**FRANKLINIA ALATAMAHA ZONE 5**

Franklin Tree: Very attractive small tree that should be treated as an ericaceous plant. Plenty of pine bark and peat moss, light mulching and water in the dry spells. The container grower should use drip to minimize moisture on the leaves. Found by William Bartram on Georgia's Altamaha River in the 1770s. \*Extinct in the wild.

**HYDRANGEA ARBORESCENS ZONE 4**  
**"Annabelle"**

Annabelle Hydrangea: Selection made at Anna Nursery in Illinois. Blooms in June and July with large white flowers. It will bloom a second time if the spent blossom is removed. Should be cut to the ground after each growing season.

**HYDRANGEA QUERCIFOLIA ZONE 5**

Oakleaf Hydrangea: Spectacular plant with multi-season appeal. Probably needs soil amendment if grown in full sun, as well as a mulch. Has white conical shaped blossom in June and July, with maroon to red Fall leaf coloration and an exfoliating bark even on immature plants.

Mountain Laurel: Some horticulturists say Mountain Laurel is the most beautiful of all native shrubs. It is a demanding shrub in that it requires excellent drainage, organic soil amendments and mulching to perform as it is capable. Use in mass plantings or as a specimen. Magnificent in flower. Liners and B&B have multi-plants per unit, as well as blooms. They are Pink, Dark Pink, Red and Banded.

Sweet Bay Magnolia: Narrow leaf, evergreen form found in Turtle-town. Upright fast grower. Seedling grown; all plants are consistently evergreen. Probably the most inland, highest elevation seed source of Magnolia Virginiana.

Sweet Azalea: A June white blooming plant with a very attractive fragrance. Will handle wetter soil conditions. These plants are from a seed source that is a compact, shrubby form.

Florida Azalea: yellow, orange, red blooming shrub that is a most vigorous plant. Grows 10’ to 12’ tall. Easy to grow.

**RHODODENDRON CALENDULACEUM\*** **ZONE 5**

Flame Azalea: Can bloom from yellow to blood red, but our seedlings are mostly bright orange when in bloom. Named by the plantsman, William Bartram, when he explored the southern mountains in 1776. Bartram said, “This is certainly the most brilliant flowering shrub yet known.” Used as a specimen, in a naturalized setting, or en masse. Grows to 10’-15’ tall. Likes a dryer soil.

**RHODODENDRON MAXIMUM\*** **ZONE 3**

Rosebay Rhododendron: Large-leafed rhododendron, growing 15’-20’ tall. Excellent deep shade plant, where its leaves develop to the fullest extent. Can be used as a screen. Should be installed with methods used in planting any other ericaceous plant.
